
THE MIDDLE OF THE WORLD


Forty minutes north of Quito, you'll find the dream of your inner child — the Middle of the World — where you can stand on both hemispheres at once and take the picture you've always wanted.







NATURE & SPRINGS

Two hours from Quito, in the heart of the Andes, we offer the perfect place for the explorer in you. Hike through cloud forests where ferns, moss and high-altitude vegetation coexist in an ecosystem that brings together both the Amazon and the Andes. Home to rare and colorful bird species, this area is a paradise for early birders seeking a peaceful start to the day. Next, follow the historic Cinnamon Road once taken by conquistadors in search of El Dorado, heading toward the Papallacta Thermal Springs, nestled at the foot of the 5,700-meter (18,714-ft) Antisana Volcano. Along the way, take in sweeping mountain views and, with luck, spot the Andean condor.

Upon arrival, unwind in curative, alkaline thermal waters surrounded by the Cloud Forest, then explore scenic trails lined with native flora, including the polylepis, or "paper tree."

HUMMINGBIRD'S PARADISE

Just one hour from Quito, the Yanacocha Reserve offers a peaceful escape into a world of extraordinary birdlife.

Leave behind the city for the melodic calls of native species in this high-altitude sanctuary, home to over 20 species of hummingbirds. Follow scenic trails through the lush cloud forest, ranging from 2,800 to 4,000 meters (8,000 to 12,000 feet) above sea level. Keep an eye out for wild rabbits, rare small mammals and vibrant orchids and bromeliads.






DANCING BIRDS IN THE CLOUDS

Just 90 minutes from Quito, the Cloud Forest is one of Ecuador's premier birding destinations. It holds the world record for the most hummingbird species seen in one place and once led the Audubon Christmas Bird Count.

Explore trails and backroads in search of the plate-billed mountain toucan, tanager finch and dazzling hummingbirds, with a chance to spot elusive antpittas or the almost-mythic cock-of-the-rock.




BECOME AN ANDEAN COWBOY


Venture into Cotopaxi National Park, where dramatic landscapes unfold in the shadow of Ecuador's second-highest peak, Mount Cotopaxi, one of the world's tallest active volcanoes. This protected area is not only home to remarkable geology, but also to a rich array of wildlife.

Over generations, the people of the central Andes have learned to live in harmony with these vast moorlands, wetlands and towering volcanoes. Today, the chagras (the Andean cowboys), welcome you into their world, sharing time-honored skills and stories passed down through the ages, shaped by their deep connection to the spirit of the mountains. And then, at midday enjoy a traditional Andean lunch featuring regional delicacies, rounding out a day immersed in the wild beauty and living culture of the highlands.

FROM JUNGLE BEAN TO CHOCOLATE BAR

Discover how cacao becomes the silky chocolate we all love in this fun, hands-on experience for the whole family. In the chocolate lab, learn about the origins of cacao before roasting, grinding and tempering beans like real chocolatiers. 
AMAZONIAN FARM TRADITIONS




AMAZONIAN FLAVORS





PIRATE TALES OF GUAYAQUIL

FROM FORESTS TO LAVA TUNNELS

Enjoy a scenic drive into the misty highlands of Santa Cruz, home to one of the Galápagos' most iconic encounters: giant tortoises roaming freely in their natural habitat. Stroll through lush pastures as these ancient creatures, some weighing over 300 kg (661.39 pound) and more than 100 years old, graze or soak in mud pools. This walk offers more than remarkable wildlife; it is a timeless moment of connection with the islands' evolutionary legacy.






PADDLING THE ENCHANTED COAST

Glide quietly by kayak through mangrove-lined inlets, lava formations and hidden beaches, where sea turtles, rays and playful sea lions often appear just within reach. 
TORTUGA BAY ESCAPE
